22nd Sunday: A Disciple Must Carry His Cross


The prophet Jeremiah had a timid and introspective disposition, yet God had chosen this wonderful prophet; *"I place my words into your mouth!"* says the Lord. Jeremiah led a lonely life, he never married, and was avoided by friends, priests and relatives because of his being a prophet and his mission. He was not a very popular prophet of his time, because nobody wants to be blamed for their sins. Jeremiah carried many crosses, he was arrested, put in jail, in an empty cistern and constantly had fear for his life. In spite of the many hardships, he continued to preach the word of God, and preached the truth.

Paul was the greatest missionary to the gentiles, he visited as many places or communities as he could, each place is different, this was the cross of Paul. He literally had to know more about every community he established to be an effective preacher to them. In Rome, he tells his readers that Christian life is our confirmation and pronouncement of what we believe. That is why Christians consecrate their bodies and their whole being to God.

A moment ago, Jesus gave Peter full authority over His Church, and suddenly he becomes a stumbling block, and himself is endanger because he does not understand the need for suffering. Jesus had to bring him back to become His disciple again. After all, a disciple as Jesus requires, must take up his cross and follow Him. He must be willing to give up everything for the Kingdom, even his own life for the sake of Christ.

A Disciple must Carry His Cross

1. It is very human to measure one's worth in life by one's success. At the beginning of Jesus' ministry, everyone was impressed by his words of preaching, *"He preached with authority and not like the Scribes."* Jesus was frustrated with the Jewish authorities, because they failed to recognize His mission.
2. Jesus did not succeed in winning over the authorities and the people as a whole. The authorities were so stubborn, was it the Father's design that Jesus had suffered and His blood was to be the ransom for their sins? Scriptures describe His death with the Greek word *dei* = must, Christ must suffer and die because this was the design of the Father and as foretold in Scriptures.
3. In Mt 4, one of the temptations of Jesus was success and avoid suffering. Why suffer, the Devil tempted Him, look for success, perform wonderful task so that people will be impressed and they will believe. Jesus responded saying: *Dt. 6:16 "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test."* He knew the design of the Father and accepted His Will wholeheartedly.
4. Jesus saved us by suffering and dying for us. Christianity is the religion of the CROSS, this is a fact, *"If a man wishes to come after me, he must deny his very self, take up his cross and follow me."* To take up one's cross means, to be ready to face our own crucifixion for the sake of Christ. WHY PRAY THE ROSARY? Part 2

Getting Your Feet Wet

If the rosary is not a part of your regular prayer life right now, it's easy to get your feet wet with this devotion. Here are five key things you need to know to get started.

First, *we don't have to pray the rosary all at once.* Sure, some people might sit down and quietly pray a whole rosary in one sitting. But we can also choose to divide it up, saying just a decade or two at a time at different points throughout the day: on the way to work, in between errands, in between meetings, while folding laundry or doing dishes. Many holy men and women and even popes have prayed the rosary this way and have found it manageable and fruitful for their busy lives.

Second, *we can pray it anywhere!* The rosary is like a portable chapel we can keep in our pocket and pull out anytime, anyplace. Whether we have a sudden, urgent situation to present to God in prayer or we just want to fill some of our day with thoughts of God, all we need to do is pull out our beads and turn to the Lord in this prayer. Indeed, the rosary is always accessible. We might pray it in a church, in our room, in our office. Or we might pray it in the car, on the exercise machine, in the grocery store line, or while cutting the grass or going for a walk. Bringing our hearts into the rhythm of the rosary is something we can do intermittently throughout the day.

Third, *we can pray the rosary in different ways*, customizing it to fit the needs of the moment. Sometimes we might focus on the words of the prayers, thinking, for example, of Gabriel's greeting to Our Lady as we slowly say with great devotion, "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." At other times, we might reflect on the mysteries of Christ's life, prayerfully contemplating scenes such as his birth in Bethlehem, his transfiguration, or his death on the cross, etching the Gospel on our hearts. At still other times, we might focus on the holy name of Jesus at the center of each Hail Mary, speaking his name tenderly with love as the pulse of our rosary.


Two and a Half Minutes That Can Change Your Day

Fourth, *it's easy to fit the rosary into your schedule.* Do you have two and a half minutes in your day that you can give to God? is the beauty of the rosary.

If I need a quick pause in my busy life—just a two-and-a-half-minute break—I can pull out my beads and pray a decade in order to regroup with the Lord and be nourished spiritually. That's all a decade takes: one Our Father, ten Hail Marys, and one Glory Be. I can do that easily, pausing for a moment in between emails, in the car, in my office, in between meetings, in between errands. I don't even have to stop some things I'm doing: I can pray a decade while cooking dinner, sweeping the floor, holding a baby, or walking to my next appointment.

If an urgent need comes up in the day—someone is in an accident, I'm about to begin a big project, my spouse is having a rough day, I have an important decision to make, I need to have a difficult conversation with someone, my child is taking an exam—I can say a quick decade right on the spot. In just two and a half minutes, I can offer a special gift to God—one decade of the rosary—for that particular intention.

Fifth, *even if I'm not able to give the rosary my full attention, it's still worth praying.* I might not always be able to completely unplug mentally from the concerns of the day. I might be exhausted, too tired to pray well. I might be distracted and unable to reach the heights of contemplation. But still, the words themselves are biblical and holy. Offering God a decade or two in the midst of my daily life gives him something beautiful, even if I give it without my full, relaxed, undivided attention. I'm giving God some space in my day and filling it with [words of praise](#) for him.

THE CHOICE OF STEWARDSHIP

What does it mean to be a good steward? Does it mean to be an active parishioner, or something more? Are we better stewards because we give more in terms of our money and time to our parish, or are we called to do even more than that?

Second, when our muscles of gratitude, generosity, and graciousness are strengthened within our parish community, we are more able to meet the challenges of this world. However, we do not become good stewards by accident. We must always choose to live this way. What will you choose?

WHY ARE ONLY MEN ALLOWED TO BE PRIESTS OR DEACONS IN THE CHURCH?

One of the most debated and — in some circles — contentious teachings of the Church is that only men can be ordained as priests and deacons. Critics see it as a way of strengthening a patriarchal system in which women have little or no voice. Those who support this teaching look to New Testament teaching (where we read of Jesus choosing only men to be apostles) and the long-standing practice of the Church. This was certainly the perspective of St. John Paul II who, in his 1994 apostolic letter, *Ordinatio Sacerdotalis*, closed the discussion on the possibility of ordaining women as priests.

In the letter, he reflected on the dignity of women and their call to share in the life and mission of the Church, but he concluded by solemnly declaring that "the Church has no authority whatsoever to confer priestly ordination on women and that this judgement is to be definitely held by all the Church's faithful" (no. 4).

This position has been upheld by Pope Francis in interviews, most notably as he returned from his 2016 visit to Sweden.


The ordination of women to the diaconate is another question and one which is being studied. In 2016, Pope Francis created a 12-member commission to study the question from several perspectives (theological, liturgical, historical, etc.). The commission issued an initial report for Pope Francis who later said that the commission had not yet produced a "definite response" to the question because of a lack of agreement on the role of female deacons in the Early Church.

For now, however, regardless of what changes might come from ongoing study and debate, the Church continues to reserve

ordination to the diaconate to men only, recognizing a vital link between the diaconate and the priesthood and the lack of certainty about the presence and function of female deacons throughout history.


